This Term we are studying all things uniquely Australian. The Children's Book Council of Australia's Book Week is 70 Years old this year and is held from August 20<sup>th</sup> to the 26<sup>th</sup>. The Theme this year is **Australia - Story Country**.

We will be holding a **Book Character Parade on Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> August at 9:15pm**. Students are to come dressed as any uniquely Australian Book Character, Identity, Sports person, historical figure, animal or building or geographical feature, any Aussie Icon you can come up with. 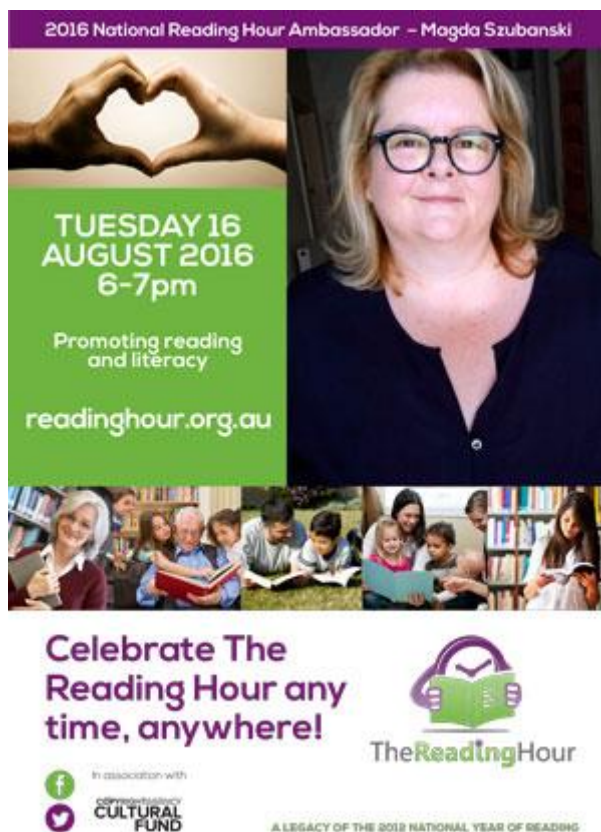


## READING HOUR

In Term 3, during Education week, the one and only Pebbles – yes the real deal, will be landing at Gosford East and will be here to stay!

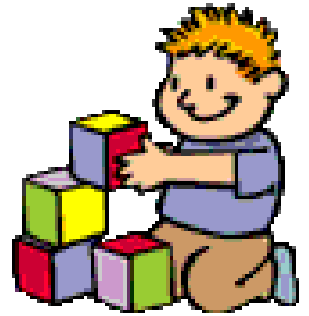


# KINDERGARTEN ENROLMENTS 2017

# HARMONY CORNER

## **1<sup>st</sup> August** [Wattle Day, NSW](#)

In New South Wales, Wattle Day is celebrated on 1 August. Wattle Day was used as a focus for raising funds to assist Australian's World War 1 effort, and to encourage a sense of patriotism. The date of Wattle Day in New South Wales changed from 1 September, the national date, to 1 August because it allowed the Red Cross to use the earlier flowering and more familiar Cootamundra Wattle (*Acacia baileyana*) rather than Golden Wattle (*Acacia pycnantha*) to raise money to support the War effort.

## **1 August** [Horses' birthday](#)

In the Southern Hemisphere all horses born during the current year are deemed to have been born on 1 August. This is important for the horse racing industry as it clarifies the age of a horse for racing purposes.

## **1<sup>st</sup> - 5<sup>th</sup> August** [Education Week – Public Schools NSW](#)

Education Week is a major event on the NSW public schools calendar. It is a time to celebrate the achievements and successes of our students, teachers and support staff across all NSW public schools. The theme for 2016 will be advertised early in the year.

## **4 August** [National Aboriginal and Islander Children's Day](#)

For an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander child, culture is a source of strength, resilience, happiness, identity and confidence. For Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children access to their culture is critical as it provides a link to their heritage and a source of strength and pride. Children learn about culture and spirituality and pride in their cultural identity from their parents, grandparents, uncles, aunties, cousins and other kin.

**5 August** [Jeans for Genes Day](#) Funds raised on Jeans for Genes Day are used to support the Children's Medical Research Institute. People wear jeans on this day and donate money for medical research.

## **6 August** [Hiroshima Day](#)

On this day activities are held to reflect on the devastating atomic bombing of Hiroshima, Japan during World War II. Some 100,000 people were killed and many more died later from the effects of radiation.

## Important Opal information from 1 August 2016

From 1 August, magnetic strip tickets (MSTs) will no longer be sold or accepted for travel within the Opal network. For easy access to public transport and lower fares, customers need to plan ahead and acquire the appropriate Opal card before 1 August 2016.

### ***What other ticketing options will be available for customers from 1 August 2016?***

Opal is the easiest and cheapest way to get around on public transport, but as a last resort, customers can buy an Adult or Child/Youth Opal single bus ticket on board bus services (excluding prepaid services). These are single-use tickets only, valid for travel from the point of purchase.

### **Who is eligible to buy Child/Youth Opal Single Bus Ticket?**

The eligibility criteria are the same as a Child/Youth Opal card:

- ☐ Children aged 4 – 15 years (inclusive)
- ☐ Full time NSW/ACT school students aged 16 years and older with a NSW Senior Secondary Student Concession card, issued by their school, as proof of entitlement.

## NSW/ACT Senior Secondary Student Concession Card



School Student Photo ID's will no longer be accepted as from 1<sup>st</sup> August 2016.

**Students 16 years and over must carry and show Senior Student Concession Card as shown.**

Holders of this concession card are entitled to half-price fares and can apply for a Child/Youth Opal card.

### Eligibility

You must be a school student aged 16 or over who is:

- enrolled in a NSW or ACT secondary school or non-government secondary school, or
- registered with the Board of Studies as a full-time home-schooled or distance education (OTEN) secondary student.

International school students who meet the criteria also get the same entitlements.

### **What should I do if My School Opal Card is Lost or Stolen?**

Report it [online](#) and order a replacement School Opal card and a fee may apply. By doing this, the old School Opal card will be cancelled and a new one will be mailed to the customer's preferred address within 5-7 days. While waiting for a replacement card, you should use a Child/Youth Opal card to travel if eligible.

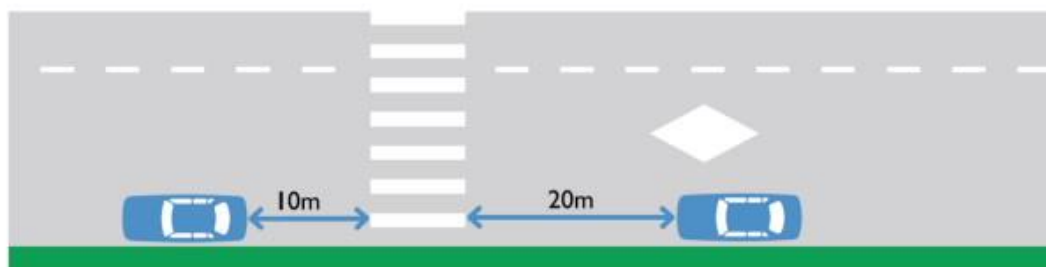


## School Traffic and Parking Around Your Local Community A Road Safety message from Central Coast Council

Parking rules are designed to stop vehicles from parking where it would be dangerous or inconvenient for others. Please consider the residents when parking in streets surrounding your school.

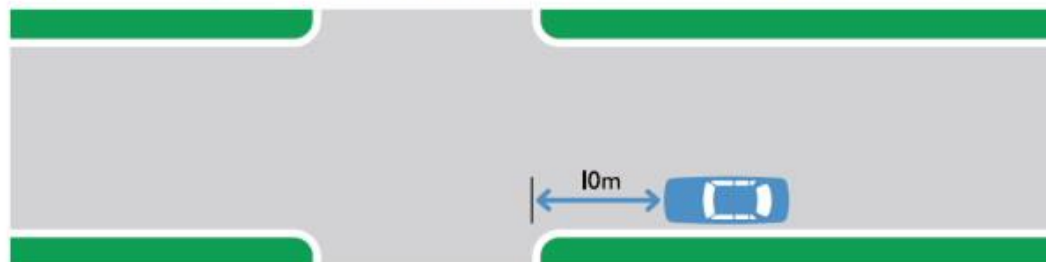
You must not stop your vehicle (that is, bring it to a stop and either stay with the vehicle or leave it parked) in the following circumstances:

- Double parked (that is in the road alongside a car that is parked)
- Across a driveway or footpath
- On a median strip or traffic island
- On footpaths and nature strips
- On or within 20 metres before and 10 metres after a children's crossing or pedestrian crossing



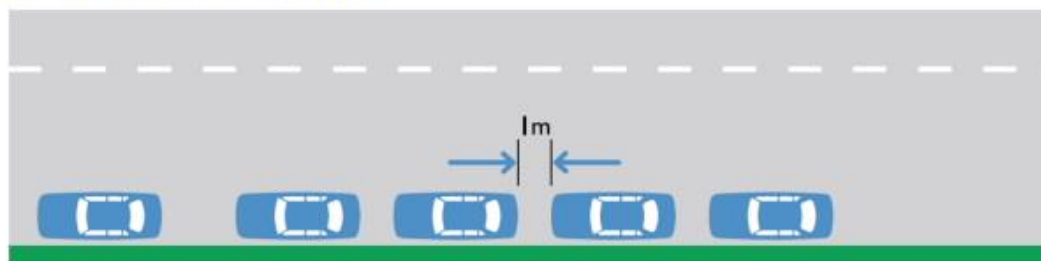
Within an intersection

Within 10 metres of an intersecting road at an intersection without traffic lights unless signposted otherwise



Between Bus Stop, Bus Zone, Taxi Stand or Taxi Zone signs

At least one (1) metre from any other parked vehicle, close as possible and parallel to the kerb, and facing the same direction as the traffic lane



Within three (3) metres of any double centre lines

Within 20 metres before and 10 metres after a bus stop



Adherence to signposting, linemarking and road rules around your school will assist in providing a safe environment for the school community and residents.

**School Bus lights** – buses use signs and orange flashing wigwag lights to warn motorists and pedestrians that they are picking up or setting down school children. The lights begin to flash when the bus stops and the doors are opened. They keep flashing for about 30 seconds after the doors close and continue even after the bus moves off. You must not drive past the bus in the same direction at more than 40 km/h while the lights are flashing as there may be children crossing or about to cross the road.



A **School Zone** is the area around a school with a speed limit of 40 km/h. Between the School Zone and End School Zone signs you must obey the school zone speed limit. The school zone speed limit only applies on gazetted school days and during the times shown on the sign.



A **No Stopping Zone** means no stopping at any time.

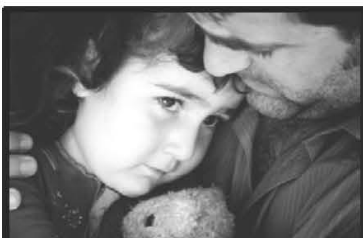


A **No Parking Zone** means that you must not stop for more than two (2) minutes. You must remain in or within three metres of the vehicle. - No Parking Zones are suitable for 'Kiss & Drop' – but you must abide by the rules.



A **Bus Zone** means that the area is restricted for bus use only. If hours of operation are shown, the restriction only applies to this time. You may use this area outside of these times.
