Parent Online Payment

Online payments are available by going to the school website, Gosford East Public School and clicking on the 'Make a Payment' tab. Complete the details as listed. If paying for an excursion please tick the box and write receipt number on the permission note to show this.

Telephone Calls and Messages to Staff and Students

School phones are attended from 8:30am to 3:30pm on school days.

Staff messages: Routine matters with teaching staff are best dealt with by notes which should always be signed and dated. More involved matters are best discussed face-to-face with teachers and appointments can be made by phoning the school office.

Urgent brief messages can be relayed to staff via the office however, teaching staff will not be available to come to the phone during normal lesson times. Please note that the Principal will always be available to discuss any matters of urgency, that are personal, confidential or of a worrying nature.

Student messages: It is requested that telephone messages for students be of an *urgent* nature only. *Urgent* brief messages may be telephoned to the school office and staff will relay them to the teacher or the child concerned. Messages should be received by 2:30pm to allow time for the message to be delivered to the classroom. Arrangements for how students are getting home each day should be conveyed to the child in the morning before school. For urgent unplanned changes, please call the office prior to 2:30pm where possible, and the message will be relayed to your child.

Change of Addresses and Telephone Numbers

Please notify the school in writing of any changes to home addresses or telephone numbers. Please include mobile phone numbers and two emergency contact people. It is vital that the school records are kept up to date to ensure that parents can be contacted quickly in times of emergency. Forms are available from the school office.

LOST PROPERTY

KIDS LOOK TO US TO KEEP THEM SAFE PARK LEGALLY IN SCHOOL ZONES

Central Coast Council would like to remind parents of parking restrictions outside your school. Please pay close attention to the signs outside your child's primary school and watch your speed when travelling through all school zones.

NO STOPPING zone

Stopping is NOT permitted at any

time. **BUS ZONE**

Stopping is not permitted during the times shown on the sign.



DOUBLE PARKING

You are not permitted to stop, OR park alongside another vehicle already parked parallel to the kerb. This means do not form a queue in the middle of the lane if you are waiting. Move on, do a loop and come back.

NO PARKING zone



Drivers may drop off and pick up children during the times shown on the sign BUT note:

- Max. Stopping time is 2 minutes – your child must exit and enter the car within this time.
- Driver must remain within 3 METRES of the vehicle – you may get out to help with bags etc.
- Stop as close as possible to the top of the zone to allow access for vehicles following behind.

Stopping ON OR ACROSS a driveway or other access point to and from a property.

Not permitted under any circumstance, you must always consider the school's neighbours by leaving space at their driveways to allow safe exit and entry to the roadway.

Travelling more than 40 km/hour through school zones may inhibit a car from stopping in time to avoid hitting a pedestrian. Parking illegally also creates serious risks as it limits the vision of other drivers.

It only takes a split second for an accident to occur and only one car to present a danger to an unknowing child.

Please be aware and park safely outside your child's school.

Health Issues

Accident / Sickness at school

It is the school's policy to contact parents in an emergency or when we believe the child's condition warrants this. Should contact details change, please ensure that the office is advised.

Medication

Pupils are not permitted to be in possession of any form of medication, (prescription/non-prescription) tablets or syrup. Medication should be handed in to school office by a parent or carer, with the child's name, class and prescription label attached to medication. A permission to administer prescribed medication needs to be completed at the office at this time. Only medication prescribed by a doctor can be administered at school.

Immunisation

The NSW Public Health (Amendment) Act 1992 requires parents to provide the school with an Immunisation Certificate or Immunisation History Statement. The Immunisation History Statement can be obtained by contacting the [Australian Childhood Immunisation Register](#) on 1800 653.

You can get an Immunisation Certificate from:

- *Your doctor (General Practitioner)*
- *Local Council (immunisation clinic)*
- *Medical Officer of your nearest Public Health Unit*

Immunisation is not compulsory. If you chose not to immunise your child you must still provide the school with an Immunisation Certificate stating that the child is NOT immunised. In the event of a vaccine preventable disease occurring in the school, unimmunised children will be required to remain at home for the duration of the outbreak, as directed by the local Public Health Unit.

Infectious Disease

The table attached is an outline of the Department of Health Regulations as they relate to some of the more common infectious diseases. Details on other diseases will be supplied when necessary.

Parents must always advise the school immediately a child contracts any infectious disease as we have students whose medical condition requires immediate advice should they come in contact with an infectious disease. Adhere to the exclusion conditions and times set out in the attached table.

Note:

Measles and Mumps are preventable by vaccination. If your child has not had measles or mumps please arrange vaccination as soon as possible.



Infectious diseases

An overview

Some illnesses may be infectious. To prevent these infections spreading to other students, please see your doctor and keep your child at home for the advised time.

Infectious disease	Time from exposure to illness	Symptoms	Do I need to keep my child home?	How can I help prevent spread?
Chicken pox	2 to 3 weeks.	Slight fever, runny nose, and a rash that begins as raised pink spots that blister and scab.	Yes, for 5 days after the rash first appears and until the blisters have all scabbed over.	Immunisation is available for children over 18 months old. It is recommended for people over 12 years who are not immune.
Conjunctivitis	1-3 days.	The eye feels scratchy, is red and may water. Lids may stick together on waking.	Yes, while there is discharge from the eye.	Careful hand washing; avoid sharing towels. Antibiotics may be needed.
Gastroenteritis	Depends on the cause: several hours to several days.	A combination of frequent loose or watery stools, vomiting, fever, stomach cramps, headaches.	Yes, at least for 24 hours after diarrhoea stops.	Careful hand washing with soap and water after using the toilet or handling nappies and before touching food.
German measles (Rubella)	2 to 3 weeks.	Often mild or no symptoms; mild fever, runny nose, swollen nodes, pink blotchy rash that lasts a short time.	Yes, for at least 4 days after the rash appears.	Immunisation (MMR) at 12 months and 4 years of age.
Glandular fever	4 to 6 weeks.	Fever, headache, sore throat, tiredness, swollen nodes.	No, unless sick.	Careful hand washing, avoid sharing drinks, food and utensils and kissing.



Infectious disease	Time from exposure to illness	Symptoms	Do I need to keep my child home?	How can I help prevent spread?
Hand, foot and mouth disease	3 to 7 days.	Mild illness, perhaps with a fever, blisters around the mouth, on the hands and feet	Yes, until the blisters have dried.	Careful hand washing especially after wiping noses, using the toilet and changing nappies.
Head lice	Time from infestation to eggs hatching usually 5 to 7 days.	Itchy scalp, white specks stuck near the base of the hairs, lice may be found on the scalp.	No, as long as headlice management is ongoing.	Family, friends and classroom contacts should be examined and managed if infested.
Hepatitis A	About 2 to 6 weeks.	Often none in small children; sudden fever, loss of appetite, nausea, vomiting, jaundice (yellowing of skin and eyes), dark urine, pale stools.	Yes, for 2 weeks after first symptoms or 1 week after onset of jaundice.	Careful hand washing; close contacts may need to have an injection of immunoglobulin; immunisation recommended for some people.
Impetigo (school sores)	1 to 3 days.	Small red spots change into blisters that fill with pus and become crusted; usually on the face, hands or scalp.	Yes, until treatment starts. Sores should be covered with a watertight dressing	Careful hand washing.
Influenza	1 to 3 days.	Sudden onset fever, runny nose, sore throat, cough, muscle and headaches.	Yes, until they feel better.	Immunisation, is recommended for the elderly and people with chronic illnesses.
Measles	About 10 to 12 days until first symptoms, and 14 days until the rash develops.	Fever, tiredness, runny nose, cough and sore red eyes for a few days followed by a red blotchy rash that starts on the face and spreads down the body and lasts 4 to 7 days.	Yes, for at least 4 days after the rash appears	Immunisation (MMR) at 12 months and 4 years. Contacts who are not immune should not attend school or work for 14 days.
Meningococcal Disease	2 to 10 days.	Sudden onset of fever and a combination of headache, neck stiffness, nausea, vomiting, drowsiness and rash.	Seek medical help immediately. Patient will need hospital treatment	Close contacts should see their doctor urgently if symptoms develop, and may need to have a special antibiotic. Immunisation with Meningococcal C vaccine at 12 months of age.
Mumps	14 to 25 days.	Fever, swollen and tender glands around the jaw.	Yes, for 9 days after onset of swelling.	Immunisation (MMR) at 12 months and 4 years of age.
Ringworm	Varies (may be several days).	Small scaly patch on the skin surrounded by a pink ring.	Yes, until the day after fungal treatment has begun.	Careful hand washing.

Infectious disease	Time from exposure to illness	Symptoms	Do I need to keep my child home?	How can I help prevent spread?
Scabies	New infections: 2 to 6 weeks; reinfections: 1 to 4 days.	Itchy skin, worse at night. Worse around wrists, armpits, buttocks, groin and between fingers and toes.	Yes, until the day after treatment has begun.	Close contacts should be examined for infestation and treat if necessary. Wash linen, towels and clothing worn in the past 2 days in hot water and detergent.
Scarlet fever	1 to 3 days.	Sudden onset sore throat, high fever and vomiting, followed by a rash in 12 to 36 hours.	Yes, until at least 24 hours of treatment has begun and the child is feeling better.	Careful hand washing. Sick contacts should see their doctor.
Slapped cheek (Erythema Infectiosum, Fifth disease, Parvovirus B19)	1 to 2 weeks.	Mild illness; fever, red cheeks, itchy lace-like rash and possibly cough, sore throat or runny nose. Can cause foetal disease in pregnant women.	No, most infectious before the rash appears.	Careful hand washing; avoid sharing drinks.
Whooping cough (pertussis)	7 to 20 days.	Starts with runny nose, followed by persistent cough that comes in bouts. Bouts maybe followed by vomiting and a whooping sound as the child gasps for air.	Yes, until the first 5 days of a special antibiotic have been taken.	Immunisation at 2,4,6, and 18 months and 4 years of age. A special antibiotic can be given for the patient and close contacts. Unimmunised contacts may be excluded from child care until the first 5 days of a special antibiotic has been taken.
Worms	Several weeks.	Itchy bottom.	No.	Careful hand washing. Whole household should be treated. Wash linen, towels and clothing worn in the past 2 days in hot water and detergent.


